### STRATEGIC WINS

#### Improved Community Funding COMMUNITY COACHING

Residents in 6 West Virginia communities who recently graduated from the Blueprint Communities\* program, including a curriculum designed to help them co-create strategic plans with their fellow residents, leveraged more than \$150,000 in funding to help them carry out those plans.

#### Increased Federal Funding SYSTEMIC CHANGE

Our active participation in the White House Interagency Working Group on Coal and Power Plant Communities (IWG), including mobilizing West Virginia-based partners to identify challenges and propose solutions, helped influence the Biden Administration's decision to bring millions in new funding for the Appalachian Regional Commission and \$1 billion in new funding for coal-impacted communities through the American Jobs Plan.

## Increased Community Leaders LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT

As part of Kickstart Communities, we expanded our Community Coaching Fellowship by creating beginner and advanced tracks, opening up applications to the public, and running fellowship cycles multiple times each year. We now have the capacity to move, at minimum, 90 West Virginians annually through intensive personal development to prepare them to lead community change.

#### Increased Community Momentum COMMUNITY COACHING

Residents in Montgomery, WV and Smithers, WV, neighboring towns that are known as "two municipalities, one community," participated in the Cultivate WV community coaching program where they used \$40,000 in seed funding to create twenty small-scale projects such as a farmers market, signage & beautification, public art, trails, events, and others. The residents leveraged more than \$60,000 in additional funding through their efforts.

#### Improved Community Storytelling SYSTEMIC CHANGE

We were selected from thousands of applicants to serve as a Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation Voices for Economic Opportunity grantee. We launched Redefined: Real Stories from West Virginia, a campaign that motivates rural residents to shift from hopelessness into roles of meaningful community leadership. Redefined has reached more than 500,000 Appalachians and is a featured program on East Tennessee Public Broadcasting and West Virginia Public Broadcasting.

#### Stronger Community Network SYSTEMIC CHANGE

The WV Community Collaborative Network, a new affinity network created to catalyze community economic development in West Virginia, launched this year with the appointment of a 15-member steering committee. This launch represented the culmination of two years of work including input from over 500 residents and partners.

### WHERE WE COACHED

Every day, The Hub's professional community coaching team is working alongside residents as they carry out time-tested plans to engage their neighbors, build their communities, and scale up their local economies. These in-depth coaching services are at the heart of transformational change in local communities.
